1            P R O C E E D I N G S  
 2            **JAKE ALMEIDA:** Okay, good morning,  
 3 everyone. I'd like to welcome you to today's  
 4 Administrative Order, or AO, 360 stakeholder input  
 5 session on Chapter 33, Special Programs regulations.  
 6 Thank you for joining us.  
 7            The purpose of this meeting is to hear  
 8 directly from stakeholders and members of the public  
 9 regarding regulatory burdens or barriers you believe  
 10 should be addressed as part of Alaska's AO 360 reform  
 11 project.  
 12            Your input is critical in helping us  
 13 shape meaningful changes that support students and  
 14 schools. And to honor your time today, the session  
 15 will end promptly on the hour.  
 16            These stakeholder meetings are  
 17 opportunities for us to listen to your perspectives  
 18 before any regulations are drafted, amended, or  
 19 repealed. This is not the formal public comment  
 20 process under the Administrative Procedure Act, or APA.  
 21 That process will begin later after draft regulations  
 22 have undergone legal review and have been formally  
 23 approved for public comment.  
 24            As part of our regulatory reform plan,  
 25 the department must create a list of all the comments

1 we receive during the stakeholder process along with  
 2 whether we intend to implement each recommendation that  
 3 you as stakeholders make. And if we don't adopt a  
 4 recommendation, we are required to explain why not.  
 5            So as an overview for today we'll first  
 6 hear a short overview of the regulations for this  
 7 meeting, and then we'll move into the comment period  
 8 where you may share your input.  
 9            Verbal feedback will be recorded,  
 10 summarized, and included in our department's reform  
 11 plan, and written feedback will also be accepted for 30  
 12 days following this session. So please refer to the  
 13 chat for information on submitting written feedback.  
 14 And, again, you will see a link for a sign-up sheet to  
 15 provide verbal comment once the regulations have been  
 16 given an overview, so we encourage you to sign up on  
 17 that.  
 18            So with that, I will now hand it over to  
 19 Heather Heineken who is our director of finance and  
 20 support services for the department, and she will give  
 21 you an overview of what these regulations are in this  
 22 chapter. Over to you, Heather.  
 23            **HEATHER HEINEKEN:** Thank you, Jake. Good  
 24 morning. Chapter 33 of 4 AAC establishes special  
 25 programs administered by the Department of Education

1 and Early Development. The chapter is organized into  
 2 several articles. Today's focus is on Articles 1, 2,  
 3 3, 4, and 6.  
 4            Article 1, special schools, establishes  
 5 the framework for statewide designated special schools  
 6 and charter schools. It includes provisions for  
 7 residential schools, such as Mt. Edgecumbe, and  
 8 district-operated statewide residential programs,  
 9 outlines administrations requirements, and defines the  
 10 department's authority over special programs.  
 11            It also establishes the process for  
 12 charter school applications, amendments, operations,  
 13 contracts, renewals, and performance accountability  
 14 along with the charter school grant program.  
 15            Article 2 covers grants for the  
 16 improvement of school performance. This establishes  
 17 the department's authority to award grants to districts  
 18 for improving student performance and school outcomes.  
 19 It includes eligibility requirements, application  
 20 procedures, requirements for district or school  
 21 improvement plans, expectations for measurable results,  
 22 timeliness, and how the department monitors use of  
 23 funds and progress towards goals.  
 24            Article 3 is our quality schools funding  
 25 grants. This establishes the quality schools grant

1 program intended to support statewide school  
 2 improvement efforts. It covers criterias districts  
 3 must meet to qualify, the purpose of the funding,  
 4 required components such as performance-based planning,  
 5 local reporting, and how the department determines  
 6 awards and monitors the use of these grants.  
 7            Article 4 covers correspondence study  
 8 programs. It establishes requirements for a district  
 9 operating correspondence programs. This includes rules  
 10 for student enrollment, allotment accounts, use of  
 11 public funds for instructional material and services,  
 12 curriculum oversight, student progress documentation,  
 13 teacher involvement, and department authority to  
 14 review, audit, place programs on a corrective action,  
 15 or require repayment for non-compliance.  
 16            And finally Article 6, funding for the  
 17 improvement of Internet speed at public schools. This  
 18 establishes a program to support broadband and Internet  
 19 speed improvements in public schools, most commonly  
 20 known as "the beg." It includes eligibility for  
 21 funding, how districts apply, allowable project types  
 22 such as infrastructure grades or bandwidth increases,  
 23 prioritization for rural or high cost areas, and the  
 24 department's role in improving, monitoring, and  
 25 reporting on funded projects. Thank you, Jake.

1           **JAKE ALMEIDA:** All right, thank you so  
2 much for that, Heather.  
3           So we are now in the comment section of  
4 this stakeholder meeting. And we still have people  
5 joining us, so I'll just keep refreshing. You were  
6 just given an overview of what these regulations, and  
7 the last link posted in the chat that you will see is  
8 the sign-up sheet to give comment on these regulations.  
9           Everyone will have two minutes, and we  
10 just ask that you provide your name, any affiliation,  
11 and provide your comment in two minutes to ensure  
12 everyone has a chance to give comment. We can answer  
13 specific questions you may have, but we're of course  
14 just first hear to listen and won't engage necessarily  
15 in any back and forth.  
16           And again, we encourage you to use the  
17 sign-up sheet. You just fill out a couple fields of  
18 information, then I see your name on the sheet and  
19 acknowledge you as people's names pop up on there.  
20           If you are unable to use the link, there  
21 is also the raise hand icon on the bottom of this Zoom  
22 meeting on your task bar, you can also click on that,  
23 and we'll knowledge you and give you two minutes to  
24 speak.  
25           And so at this time we're just awaiting
